Staying Safe Online –

As you know, we as a school routinely monitor what the children have been attempting to search for online. Unfortunately there have been a few occasions recently when we have found evidence that some children have been trying to search for inappropriate subject matter. Fortunately our filter system in school has thwarted their efforts. But do you have the same level of protection for online safety at home?

What are parental controls?

Parental controls are software and tools which you can install on phones or tablets, games consoles or laptops – and even your home broadband.

You can also use them to help you block or filter the content your child sees when searching online. And family-friendly public WiFi can help when you're out and about.

Parental controls are also available to help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- stop them from downloading apps they're too young for
- manage the content different members of the family can see.

So whatever your child is doing online, there's a way that you can help keep them safe.

More children are using the internet than ever before; 92% of 5- to 15-year-olds are online in 2017, up from 87% last year. More than half of preschoolers, 53% of 3-4s and 79% of 5-7s are online – a 12% rise on last year; much of this growth is driven by the increased use of tablets.

How to avoid inappropriate videos on YouTube

- The YouTube Kids app filters out most - but not all - of the disturbing videos.
- YouTube suggests turning on "restricted mode" which can be found at the bottom of YouTube page
