Did Father Christmas bring gadgets for your household this year? Do you need help and practical advice in setting them up safely? The NSPCC and O2 are working together with the aim of helping parents keep their children safe online. The partnership now offers advice to parents through Net Aware www.net-aware.org.uk and the Online Safety Helpline.

More children are using the internet than ever before; 92% of 5- to 15-year-olds are online in 2017, up from 87% last year. More than half of preschoolers, 53% of 3-4s and 79% of 5-7s are online – a 12% rise on last year; much of this growth is driven by the increased use of tablets.

How to avoid inappropriate videos on YouTube

- The YouTube Kids app filters out most - but not all - of the disturbing videos.
- YouTube suggests turning on "restricted mode" which can be found at the bottom of YouTube page
